Fighting to Come Home



Isla Elliot gets her fighting spirit from her mom. Isla was born with CHARGE Syndrome, a rare genetic condition which impacts her ability to see, hear, eat and breathe safely. Isla's first few months were precarious. Her fragile respiratory status meant she was dependent on oxygen, a ventilator, continuous feeds, and very vulnerable to infection. With Isla requiring constant monitoring, her parents only option was long-term hospitalization in a pediatric subacute care facility. Going home without their daughter was devastating.

Yessica, Isla's mom, remembers, "I wanted to bring her home so badly. It was a crazy time. I tried to be with Isla a few hours every day, all while

working and balancing care for our other daughter. My husband worked full-time too and quitting one of our jobs was impossible. I didn't know what to do, but I knew I wanted her home." Thus, began Yessica's battle. "I posted online and asked everybody for ideas on how to get Isla home."

Finally, Yessica heard about Coastal Kids Home Care from the mom of another medically fragile toddler. A month later, when she was fourteen months old, Isla finally came home with round-the-clock shift nursing through Coastal Kids. Fast forward nineteen months and Isla is crawling and pulling to stand. Today, Isla is still fighting – though surrounded by loving parents, a big sister, and dedicated nurses – her battle to learn, grow and stay healthy is a lot easier.

GROWING UP WITH COASTAL KIDS

In 2008, when Jordan Salazar was in middle school, he was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL). Almost immediately he was plunged into an intense treatment regimen. He would spend five days in the hospital, and return home, and then go back two weeks later. This cycle repeated until he was referred to Coastal Kids Home Care.

Jordan recalls, "During that time, every day at home was a gift." Ultimately, Jordan lost most of his high school years

to harsh treatments and painful, sometimes scary, side effects. "I remember being home, feeling really down, and Margy would show up for a blood draw. She would lighten the mood – often make me laugh. She would leave, and somehow the day ahead would look brighter."



In 2011, Jordan beat cancer. But the effects of his treatment left him with long-term impacts - including the need for bilateral hip replacements. His experience with pediatric cancer led Jordan to dedicate his life to being healthy. For the past eight years he has studied the impacts of chemotherapy on patient well-being and identified ways to help cancer survivors. "Health is so much more then just eating well and working out. Being healthy is a lifestyle. I help people transform their health--mental,

physical, emotional and I love doing it."

ELENA'S FAVORITE THING


Elena Ramirez has a favorite everything. She has a favorite toy, a favorite song and a favorite sound effect. She was also born with a favorite side. Elena has congenital muscular torticollis (CMT) which means she has a head tilt to the right side. At four months old she was referred to Coastal Kids Physical Therapist, Patricia Krall

(PT. DPT. C/NDT).

"I have been seeing Elena for a little over a year now," says Trish. "We work on pulling up to stand, reaching for toys on the opposite side, and even walking!"

Trish comes once a week and uses various toys for Elena to practice stretching and movements. Trish is strategic about the placement of the toy and challenges Elena to turn towards the toy and reach for it. Gradually, Trish moves toys further so that Elena can move towards them.

"Although she is still a little behind, the gap seems to be closing each time I assess her," Trish says. "I used to see her two
